

Composting Barns

Over the last short while, composting barns have gained popularity with innovative farmers for cattle farming year-round, providing a comfortable environment for the animals to preserving the quality of the paddocks in winter, and shelter from the sun in the warmer months. The by-product of compost also slashes the need for additional fertilization, which means big savings.



Composting barns provide a controlled indoor environment that offers several advantages for cattle and farmers during the winter season:



By keeping any stock indoors, composting barns protect them from the adverse effects of cold, wet, and windy conditions. This reduces stress and helps maintain the overall health and well-being of the animals.

The barns improve comfort and hygiene by providing comfortable bedding for the cattle, promoting proper rest and reducing the risk of injuries. Furthermore, the barns' well-managed composting process helps maintain cleanliness and hygiene, minimizing the likelihood of disease transmission among the herd.



Composting barns' by-product of nutrient-rich compost can be spread on the pastures once winter ends. This enhances soil fertility, promotes healthy plant growth, and reduces the reliance on synthetic fertilizers. This closed-loop system reduces the need for synthetic fertilizers and promotes sustainable agriculture practices.



They ensure that winter pastures aren't over-grazed or pugged and also mean reduced manure management, giving a sustainable solution for managing cattle waste and minimize the need for additional manure applications. Some barns are equipped with systems that capture and compost cattle manure, reducing the amount of waste that needs to be disposed of or stored.



A recent study of farmers who have adopted this practice into their businesses showed that composting barns have emerged as a game-changer in New Zealand's cattle farming industry, offering a range of benefits for both cattle and farmers.

By providing a comfortable and protected environment for the animals during the winter months, these barns improve animal welfare. Simultaneously, they preserve the quality of paddocks by eliminating the damage caused by winter grazing, reducing the need for additional manure, and promoting nutrient recycling through composting.

And, as the demand for sustainable farming practices increases, in particular from overseas trading partners, composting barns present an eco-friendly

solution that supports the well-being of cattle and the productivity of New Zealand's agricultural lands.

While all farmers interviewed as part of the study reported improved financial performance, it was the intangible benefits of composting shelters they weighted most highly, given that labour shortages, environmental performance and animal welfare considerations are all significant challenges that dairy farmers are grappling with on a daily basis.

All farmers interviewed saw increased cow comfort and welfare, better staff working conditions, a lift in labour efficiency, improved environmental performance, and reduced pasture damage as real drivers for their investment. They also noted benefits to animal welfare through the provision of a comfortable environment that protected




cows from both the heat in summer and cold, wet conditions in winter.

For staff, the shelters mean they can work out of the weather, which is particularly beneficial during calving. Where the shelters replaced winter grazing, there was a significant workload reduction. The ability to manage over-grazing and pugging damage also reduced farmer stress.

Other farmers noted a reduction in calf mortality and a pleasurable experience for staff and animals over the calving period. One farm has even installed cameras to allow staff to complete night calving checks remotely.

In addition to these intangible benefits, the farmers reported a significant reduction in their winter feed requirements compared to a 24/7 outdoor system, due both to reduced maintenance requirements and feed wastage.


One farm noted a 50% drop in the winter feed allocation relative to their previous winter cropping system.



Wintering Barns
